



**NOTICE OF RACE  
BALMAIN SAILING CLUB COMBINED SAILING PROGRAMME  
21 AUGUST 2016 – 4 AUGUST 2017**

**1. Organising Authority**

The Organising Authority is the Balmain Sailing Club (“BSC”).

**2. Rules**

The races will be governed by the *rules*, as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2013 - 2016 (“RRS”) of the International Sailing Federation (ISAF), and the prescriptions and regulations of Yachting Australia (“**Special Regulations**”) these may be amended by the Sailing Instructions.

Changes to the RRS:

RRS 50.2 and 50.3: Fixed and retractable spinnaker poles and bowsprits will be permitted for the purpose of setting asymmetrical spinnakers.

In the event of conflict between any of the rules or regulations, other than RRS, the Sailing Instructions will prevail.

#### **4. Sailing Instructions**

The sailing instructions will be available on the BSC's website: [www.balmainsailingclub.com](http://www.balmainsailingclub.com).

The Sailing Committee of the BSC will be the Race Committee under the RRS.

#### **5. Courses**

The courses shall be as detailed in the Sailing Instructions for each series.

#### **6. Handicaps / Scoring**

Handicaps will be based on time correction factors (TCF) as determined by the Sailing Committee. The scoring system will be set out in the sailing instructions.

#### **7. Eligibility**

Yachts shall comply with the Special Regulations Part 1 for Race Category 7. An audited Special Regulations Equipment Form for Category 7 (or higher) shall accompany the race entry if not already held by the Balmain Sailing Club.

Yachts shall not carry anchors protruding beyond the bow while racing.

#### **8. Trophies and Prizes**

Prizes will be awarded to the first, second and third placing boats in each race division.

Trophies will also be awarded to first, second and third placing in each Series Pointscore in each Division. Pointscore series are only open to series entries.

#### **9. Entry & Entry Fees**

Entry should be completed via the [www.balmainsailingclub.com](http://www.balmainsailingclub.com) website.

Entry fees are nominated on the website.

The BSC will waive the entry fee to the 2017 West Harbour Summer and Winter Series for boats from DSC, GFS and PRSC who have entered and paid the 2016/2017 race fees for their respective club.

#### **10. Results and List of Entries**

#### **11. Risk Warning**

The Organising Authority advises owners, skippers and anyone who participates in yachting events conducted by the Organising Authority that participation in the sport of yachting, whether racing or otherwise, can be dangerous and can result in harm, personal injury and property damage.

The Organising Authority is not responsible for any harm or injury suffered by any person in any yachting event of whatever nature conducted by the Organising Authority. All participants acknowledge that competing in yachting events may be dangerous and may result in harm or personal injury and they participate in such events aware of such dangers and voluntarily accept any risk of harm.

#### **12. Competitors Declaration**

It is the responsibility of owners and skippers to ensure that each boat nominated on the entry complies with the 'rules' as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing 2013-2016 and in 2017 the Racing Rules of Sailing 2017-2019.

All competitors who entry in doing so have made a declaration to the Organising Authority that the nominated boat will at all times while racing comply with the requirements of Yachting Australia and the Sailing Instructions, including:

(a) RRS 46;

(b) the Yachting Australia Special Regulations;

(c) be covered by current Third Party Property Liability insurance and Third Party Personal Liability insurance of not less than \$10,000,000 (ten million) for each separate incident. All insurance cover shall be maintained during the period of racing;

(d) the person who lodges the entry with the Organising Authority warranting to the Organising Authority that he or she will draw the attention of any person who competes on the yacht the subject of the entry in any event conducted by the Organising Authority to the risk warning above;

(e) the person who lodges this entry form with the Organising Authority acknowledging receipt of the risk warning above and releasing the Organising Authority from any claim or liability whatsoever for any harm or personal injury suffered by him, or by any person claiming through him, in any event conducted by the Organising Authority.

### **13. Responsibilities**

- (a) All those taking part in these races do so at their own risk and responsibility. Specific attention is drawn to RRS 4, which states; "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone". The BSC, the Race Committee and other race officials are not responsible for any damage or injury either afloat or ashore.
- (b) The BSC, the Race Committee and other race officials are not responsible for the seaworthiness of a boat whose entry is accepted or the sufficiency or adequacy of its equipment.
- (c) All those taking part in these races are reminded of their obligations as set out in the Yachting Australia Special Regulations clause 1.02 Owner's Responsibility.
