- The Meeting commenced 6-30 pm.
- Apologies were received from Ed Tacey & Mike West
- The Minutes of the BSC Management Committee of 3 November 2021 were approved without amendment.

ACTIONS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MINUTES:

- CR advised that the Development Application (DA) for the new dock has been lodged with the Inner West Council (IWC) (see plans attached to last month's minutes).
- CG advised that he has commenced discussions with both the IWC and the Transport for NSW
 (TN) in respect of the expired leases, both organisations were happy to allow BSC to continue
 holding over on the leases until such time as the new dock has been completed and an updated
 survey plan completed.
- CG advised that TN have approved signs being placed on the pontoon pylons notifying that swimming and diving in the immediate vicinity of the pontoons has been banned by TN.

MATTERS FOR DISCUSSION

The Committee discussed the following matters:

It was agreed that the planned Pubs Challenge should be postponed until next year's October Regatta. DS advised the committee of the discussions he has had with CR and AG regarding the 2022 Regatta (see full details in the Club Managers Report below)

The Committee endorsed the recommendations set out in DS's report in respect of the Classic Boat Festival for it to be combined with the Couta boats and agreed that the Regatta would be held over two weekends being Sunday 23 October and Sunday 30 October 2022.

It was agreed a Christmas Party would be held after there last series twilight race on 17 December and that a Xmas hamper raffle would be set up.

CLUB MANAGERS REPORT:

22 BALMAIN REGATTA

I propose that the 2022 Balmain Regatta be held on Sunday the 23rd of October for Classic Boats including Couta Boats, Ranger Class, Metre boats (dragons, 5.5s, 6m, 8m, 12m), Museum and Heritage fleet boats, tall ships, historic work boats, vintage skiffs and waterman skiffs.

This date would coincide with the Couta boat fleet, many of whom will be travelling from Victoria to participate in the SASC's 2022 Gaffer's Day on Sunday the 16th of October 2022. This will also coincide with the 150-year anniversary of the SASC and the 100-year anniversary of the RPEYC.

I also propose that we schedule the 2022 Regatta to continue on the following Saturday the 29th of October for the 'Balmain Regatta Pub Challenge' and on the traditional 'last Sunday in October' being the 30th of October for the 'Balmain Regatta for Modern yachts.

HALL HIRE

Hall Hire bookings are increasing and we have bookings on every weekend leading up to Christmas and for several in the new year.

MEMBERSHIP

Currently membership stands at 213 which is down a bit on last year, mainly due to the uncertainty surrounding CFOVID-19 and the return to sailing and socialising. People tended to wait to join this year until there was more clarity with regards to lockdowns.

SAILING SCHOOL

The sailing school has returned to profit and there have been courses for the past 2 months and inquiries are increasing.

SAILING /RACING

Racing was impacted by the COVID-19 lockdowns, and, since returning, fleet sizes are a bit smaller than for the same time last year. We cancelled last Friday's racing due to severe weather.

FOOD & BEVERAGE

Food sales have been strong despite the short season and the limited capacity allowed under the social distancing restrictions, however profits from food sales are currently greater than they have been for the same periods for the past few years. Bar sales are similarly impacted by COVID, however margins and profitability remain positive.

INCOME

November cash flows have been impressive compared to previous years largely due to the opening of the club, racing, hall hires, sailing school participation. The club's net profit is currently well up compared to the past 2 years.
